Skills for Independence

The Independent Living Skills curriculum is designed to develop learners' readiness for independent or shared community living. This is achieved by focusing on the skills required to live as independently as possible and to make a successful transition out of college. For all learners, this will involve identifying long-term transitional aims to ensure that the skills they develop can be successfully transferred into their post college placement.

Skills for Communication and Wellbeing

Our autism specific curriculum is designed to meet the needs of learners with complex communication difficulties. This is a highly structured and experiential learning programme which develops and reinforces communication and functional skills. The curriculum is based upon a total communication philosophy, with the utilisation of a wide range of tools and methods to develop learners' understanding and help them to be understood.

Thornbeck College offers personalised learning programmes for neurodiverse learners. Learners access programmes that support their social inclusion. The curriculum aims to prepare learners for life and work. Possible Pathways:

Preparation for Work

This is an individualised study programme for learners with an EHCP between 16 and 25 years old who would like to progress to work or further training. Learners identify their goals for work, life and future learning. There are 5 vocational pathways available.

Learning For Living Programme

This is an individualised study programme for learners with an EHCP between 16 and 25 years old who would like to learn to live independently and/or get prepared for work. The learners aim to become as independent as possible. Learners will have opportunities to develop practical skills such as cooking or shopping.

Supported Internship Programme

The Supported Internship Employability Programme is an individualised programme for learners between 16 and 25 years old with an EHCP who want to aim to move into employment and need extra support to do so. The programme usually runs for about a year. The programme involves the learners working closely with a host employer whilst gaining additional skills outside of the workplace. Sensory Programme This is an individualised programme for learners between 16 and 25 years old with an EHCP who would like to develop their social communication skills and ability to self-regulate. Learners will develop strategies to overcome barriers to their learning.

ESPA College

General Info:

ESPA College provides an educational experience for learners with Autism between ages16 and 25 years old. ESPA colleges are based in Sunderland, Middlesbrough and Newcastle. Their aim is to raise aspirations and improve lives. The curriculum focuses on Social Communication, Emotional



Literacy and Self-Management. The curriculum also includes Functional Skills Maths, English and ICT from Entry 1 to Level 3. The curriculum is supported with a range of employability options too.
